

**EVIDENCE-BASED POLICY MAKING TO PROMOTE  
SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE DEVELOPMENT TO COMBAT HUNGER**

Agree with the very fundamental topic: 1. Food is the first basic needs and always the top priority in any development agenda of any country; 2. But even until now, is still so many people suffer from hunger, and its related issues such as stunting. Data: 500 million in Asia and 250 million in Africa.

But I want to stress and add few points. *First* points is that global hunger (goal 2) should part of the suggested entry point of GSDR 2019 – food system and nutrition pattern, and I will explain few points why we need to do this. *Second*, I want to respond on one of guiding question for this dialogue, that is “how to make farming economically more attractive and socially more rewarding career in developing countries?” and especially for young generations and give concrete example that will be good to be used for South-South and Triangular Cooperation.
